What is an Apprenticeship?

An Apprenticeship is a mix of real work and learning. Apprentices earn a wage and gain experience whilst working towards a number of qualifications. An Apprenticeship follows a Level 2 programme and can lead onto an Advanced Apprenticeship which is a Level 3 programme.

Overview

This Apprenticeship covers a wide range of job roles in the health care and social care fields. Social care is about helping people with a particular need, such as the disabled or the elderly. You should be interested in working with young people or adults. The health care sector in the UK employs approximately two million people, equating to about 7% of the workforce. The public sector (including NHS trust/health authority) accounts for 73% of employment in the UK's health sector, whilst 21% are employed in the private sector.

The remaining workforce is employed in local authorities and other organisations. As an apprentice in Health Care, you could work in hospitals, the community, doctors' surgeries, hospices, private clinics or opticians.

Starting salary (once qualified) ranges from £11,000 - £17,000.

Example Job Roles as an Apprentice

- Care Worker
- Day Care Assistant
- Healthcare Assistant
- Healthcare Support Worker
- Home Care Assistant
- Nursing Assistant

Apprenticeship Framework

There are a number of elements to each Apprenticeship and this is called the framework. Each Apprenticeship framework has three main strands:

- Competence based element
- Technical element
- Skills element

The three strands are sometimes accompanied by additional qualifications to give the most relevant skills and knowledge required for the job, these are broken down as follows:

Competence Element

Apprenticeship - NVQ Level 2 in Health & Social Care

Advanced - NVQ Level 3 in Health & Social Care

Technical Element

Apprenticeship - Certificate in Health and Social Care Level 2

Advanced - Certificate in Health & Social Care Level 3

Skills Element

Apprenticeship - Key or Functional Skills in Communication Level 1 + Application of Number Level 1

Advanced - Key or Functional Skills in Communication Level 2 + Application of Number Level 2

Other Additional Study

Apprenticeships Available

- Apprenticeship Level 2 - on completion this is equivalent to 5 A* - C grade GCSE's
- Advanced Apprenticeship Level 3 - on completion this is equivalent to 2 A-levels
